# The Tale of Two Prayers

Luke 18: The Resume vs. The Regret

The Pharisee

**God, I thank you that I am not like other men—extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get.**

THE RELIGIOUS RESUME (REJECTED)

The Tax Collector

God, be merciful to me, a sinner.

THE CRY FOR MERCY (JUSTIFIED)

THE IMPLEMENTATION

Stop trying to justify yourself when you pray. Your deeds are less important than your posture. Don't look up; get on your face and acknowledge your need for grace.

# The Trap of Comparison

The Pharisee's error wasn't just arrogance; it was an assumption of knowledge. He prayed, "Thank God I am not like them." But the logic of humility dictates that you do not know the full context of another person's life.

## The Unknown Context:

- You do not know what it is like to be them.
- You do not know their specific struggles.
- You do not know their history.
- Therefore, it is impossible to say, "I would do better if I were them."

You are not in a position to judge—only to ask, "What can the Kingdom do for you?"

# The Danger of Elevation

## The Spiritual Paradox

When you think you stand,  
you are most liable to fall.  
The enemy will whisper,  
“Wow, you have become a  
very humble person.” The  
moment you agree and  
take pride in your humility,  
you have lost it.

## THE IMPLEMENTATION

Recognize that a  
haughty spirit is a  
warning sign.

You would rather  
have the wisdom of  
God than the  
disgrace of a  
fallen person.  
Choose the “lower  
fall” of voluntary  
humility over the  
“crash” of  
destruction.



# The Divine Promise

*James 4:10 | 1 Peter 5:6*

Humble yourselves  
under the **mighty**  
hand of God... and  
He will *exalt* you.

We are merely sojourners in His plan. We are not the authors of our own elevation. The promise of riches, honor, and life is the reward for humility, but the timing belongs to God.

## THE IMPLEMENTATION

Trust God's timing.

Stop striving for promotion. If God wants you promoted, He will do it.

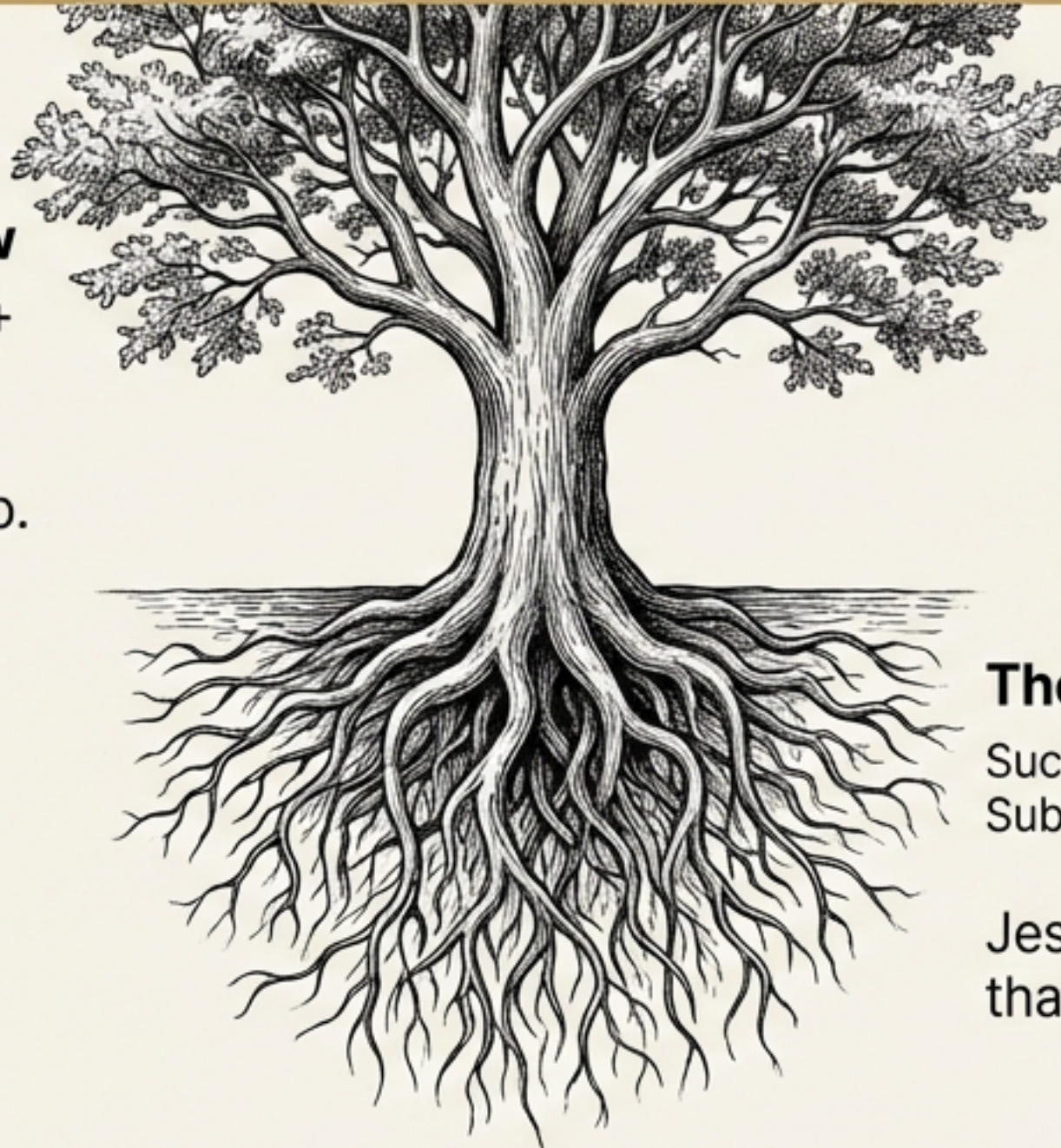
Your job is to stay under His "Mighty Hand" continuously.

# The Fear of the Lord vs. The Hustle

## The Worldly View

Success = Talent + Ability + Hustle

Climbing to the top.



## The Kingdom View

Success = Surrender + Submission + Fear of the Lord

Jesus is the root that supports us.

## THE IMPLEMENTATION

Embrace the 'Fear of the Lord' as your starting point.

Shift your focus from worldly achievement to spiritual surrender.

Trust that Jesus is your foundation; stop relying on your own strength.

Stop trying to climb. **God does not need your talent** as much as He **needs your surrender.**



# The Spiritual Gymnasium

Humility is not a one-time achievement. It is a state of conditioning.



**The Workout:** Humility requires a conscious, daily choice. If you stop, you return to your default state of pride.



**The Resistance:** God initiates testing not to break us, but to see what is in our hearts. This testing is more precious than gold.



**The Maintenance:** You must constantly “go to the gym” of spiritual discipline to maintain the condition.

## THE IMPLEMENTATION

Embrace the testing. Constantly check your own heart. Treat humility as an ongoing exercise, not a badge you have already earned.

# The Wardrobe of the Believer

## Colossians 3:12



Put on then, as God's chosen ones...

- **Compassionate Hearts**
- **Kindness**
- **Humility**
- **Meekness**
- **Patience**

Even if you know you are right in an argument, choose humility. You do not need to win every point. Trust that God's Spirit will show people what they need to see in due time.

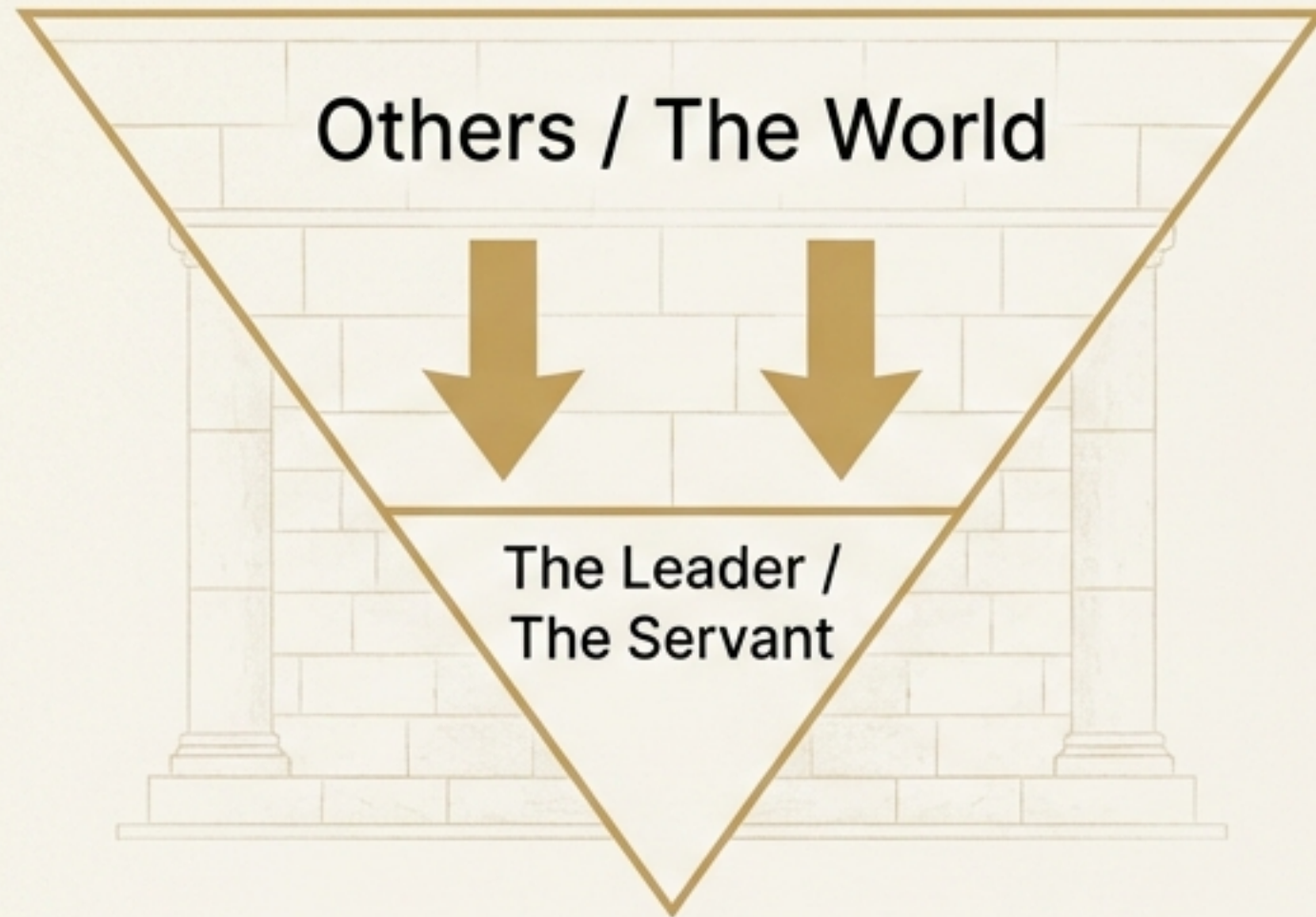
### THE IMPLEMENTATION

Practical Wardrobe Advice:

Clothe yourself with humility before you leave the house. Be willing to lose an argument to win a soul.

# The Servant Mandate

Mark 9:35 | Philippians 2:3



If anyone would be first, he must be last of all and servant of all.

Move from Selfish Ambition to Counting others more significant.

True greatness is found in lowliness. We must adopt the mind of Christ, who emptied Himself.



# Living in Harmony

The Contact Point: Humility is tested where the rubber hits the road—in our dealings with difficult people.

“Associate with the lowly.  
Do not be wise in your  
own sight.”

— Paul the Apostle

(“I have become all things to all men  
that I might win some.”)

## THE IMPLEMENTATION

Live in harmony.

Avoid social climbing  
within the church.

Treat the homeless  
man and the leader  
with the exact same  
level of dignity.

# Secrecy in Righteousness



**The Warning:** Beware of practicing righteousness to be seen by others. Do not sound a trumpet when you give.

**The Strategy:** Do your giving and praying in secret. Let your Father who sees in secret reward you.

Secrecy kills the comparison trap. It keeps your focus squarely on God rather than human applause.

# The Ultimate Example: Jesus Christ

Muted Gold Anchor: John 3:30



“He must increase, but I must decrease.”

## The Paradox:

Jesus was **Almighty God in human flesh**. He knew exactly what He was capable of, yet He **did not show it off**.

## The Action:

He **emptied Himself**. He took the **form of a servant**.

## The Takeaway:

**True strength is not arrogance**; real strength is found in a “**lowliness of spirit**.” If God Incarnate served, who are we to be served?

# The Transformation of Paul

## THE DICTATOR

Radical persecutor.  
Aggressive personality.  
Relied on status.



### The Shift:

When he met Jesus, his ambition was not deleted; it was inverted.

The Holy Spirit changes the aggressive into the servant.

## THE BOND- SERVANT

A servant of Christ.  
"I am the least of the apostles."  
Sacrificed himself for others.

## THE IMPLEMENTATION

It doesn't matter how "religious" or 'strong' your personality is naturally.

True transformation is found in surrendering your strength to service.

# The Non-Negotiable Requirement

This is not optional. It is not just for leadership. It is what the Lord requires of every believer.

# The Way Up Is Down

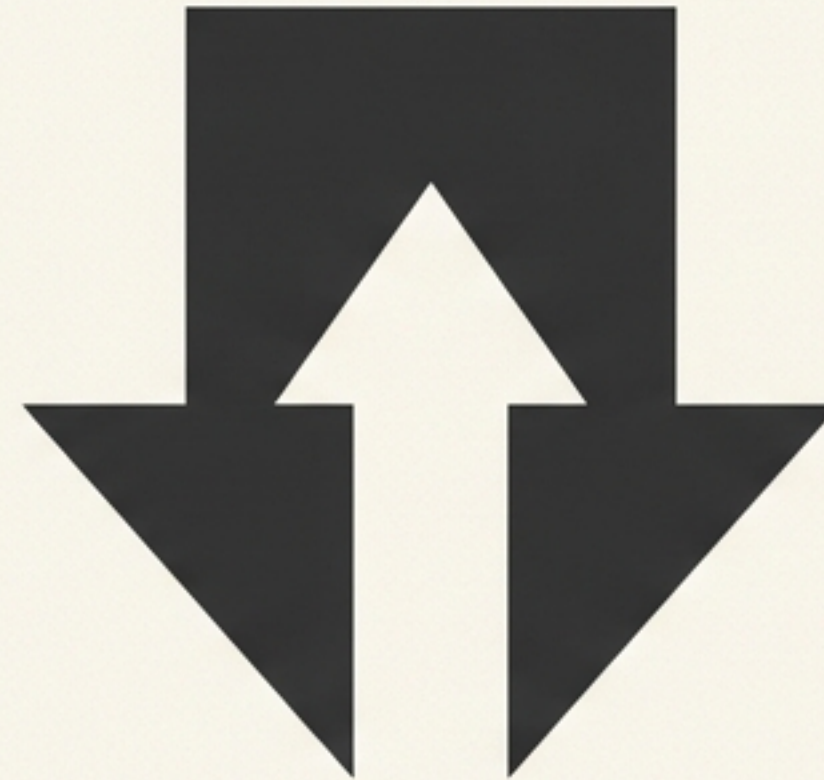
The highest place

validation from  
others. Embrace the  
posture of a  
servant, and allow  
God to be the one  
who exalts.
